Biographical Sketch

James Gibbs (1915-1990) worked for the Safetee Glass Company. In addition, he conducted research on topics including United States Clockmakers with a focus on Pennsylvania clockmakers, the Dueber Hampden Watch Company, bank time clocks, and calendar clocks.

James Gibbs was an early member of the NAWCC, Inc., and served in many leadership positions within the organization. In 1961 he became President of the NAWC, Inc., and from 1974 until his death he was Chairman of the Editorial Committee. He was also a trustee of the NAWCC Museum from its inception until 1986. Moreover, he was an author, writing many articles for the *NAWCC Bulletins*, as well as several *Bulletin Supplements*; and he also wrote several books, including *Pennsylvania Clocks and Watches*, *Buckeye Horology*, and *Dixie Clockmakers*.

Pennsylvania Clocks and Watches was published in 1984. This 286 page book tells the story of timepieces in PA from the time of William Penn to the past century. Arranged by county, information is provided about different watch and clockmakers in each geographic are, a as well as about some of the businesses they founded; and he also makes a point of distinguishing clockmaking as being a highly skilled craft rather than just an occupation. Written description are also given of various clockworks and many of these are illustrated in picture form in the book.

Buckeye Horology was published in 1971, and since the author was a native of Canton, OH, he had an inherent interest in Buckeye horology. In this book he tells the history of clockmaking in the various counties of OH, and he also includes many photographs of OH clocks and clockworks that were made there.

Dixie Clockmakers was written in 1979 and is a histosry of 18th and 19ty century clockmaking in the South. Until the time that the atuhor wrote this book, very little had been written on the subject of clockmaking and horological activity south of the Mason Dixon line; therefore, he decided to devote a chapter to each state—DE, MD, DC, VA, NC, and SC, and the final chapter contains the balance of the Southern states. Records seem to indicate that the most important clockmakers were in the geographic areas having the greatest wealth and cultural refinement, South Carolina being the most notable state when it comes to horological data. European immigration was responsible for providing the South with some its earliest clockmakers and the Southern clockmakers were quite inventive, with some of their accomplishments including 26 horological patents, mathematical instruments, and fever thermometers.

Content & Structure

• Scope & Content: This collection consists of papers and photographs that Gibbs based his research on for several of his books. This includes research on Pennsylvania clockmakers broken down by county, Dueber Hampden Watch Company, Ohio clockmakers, Alabama clockmakers, Louisiana clockmakers, Virginia clockmakers, Tennessee clockmakers, and correspondences from different individuals.
