## **Biographical/Historical Sketch**

Biographical History: Charles Alvah Smith was lived his whole life in Battleboro, Vermont. Born in 1867, he worked for his father's baby carriages manufacturing company. Upon retirement he began making wooden clocks, of which there are

614 variations. He rose to prominence when an article featuring his clock making was published by the Saturday Evening Post. Charles Alvah Smith died in 1946.

#### **Content & Structure**

Scope & Content: This collection consists of two boxes. Box #1 consists of family history, history of the family company, patents, shop notebook, sketches, and notes, photos of workshop, articles, and photographs of clocks, letters to Bert Dorloff, negatives, and obituary. Box #2 consists of mostly sketches and photographs of some clocks (#1 to #612).
